INDIA OF MY DREAMS

Imagine India is pollution-free! Let's calculate how much cleaner the air would be:

- 1. **Research:** Find the average number of cars in Delhi. (You can search online or ask your parents).
- 2. **Calculation 1:** Let's say each car emits 5 kg of carbon dioxide (CO2) daily. Multiply the number of cars in your city by 5 kg to find the total CO2 emission from cars each day.
- 3. **Imagine a cleaner future:** If all cars switch over to electric vehicles (EVs) that don't emit CO2, how much CO2 we would save daily? (This is the total emission you calculated earlier).
- 4. What are the other ways to control pollution? Suggest any two of them.

Next, dream of a greener India! Let's plan your lawn space:

- 1. **Choose an area:** Pick a familiar place in front of your home where you can plan to construct a lawn.
- 2. **Measure it:** Take an estimated length and breadth of your lawn.
- 3. **Calculate the area:** Multiply the length by the breadth to find the area in square metres.
- 4. **Flower beds:** How many rectangular flower beds do you want in your lawn and what will be the length and breadth of each flower bed? Calculate the area of a flower bed.
- 5. What is the minimum green space requirement per individual according to WHO?
