Include visuals such as charts, graphs, diagrams, or photographs to enhance understanding.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Depth of understanding of global challenges and their root causes.
- Creativity and feasibility of proposed solutions.
- Integration of scientific principles and real-life examples.
- Clarity, organization, and presentation of the project.
- By engaging in this holiday homework, Class 8 students will develop a deeper understanding of the world's most pressing issues and explore how science and social science disciplines can contribute to finding solutions.
